GOVERNMENT SEEKS TO BRING ELECTRICITY TO 99.5% OF DOMINICAN HOMES BY 2030 - DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Presidencia.gob.do - La Altagracia.- Thanks to the efforts of the government, through the Ministry of Energy and Mines (MEM), 98.2% of Dominicans currently have access to electricity. However, this administration aims to further close this gap, reaching 99.5% electricity coverage in the next five years and positioning the country as a leader in electricity access in the region.

COMMITTEE WANTS QUICK DECISION FROM THE CIVIL HOUSE ON THE NATIONAL CYBERSECURITY AGENCY - BRAZIL

Digital Convergence - The National Cybersecurity Committee still believes that the Civil House can provide a quick response on the proposal to structure a national system to deal with this issue, crowned by the creation of an agency with broad powers. "We tried to provide conditions for the government to reflect, considering budgetary factors, personnel and the scope of the agency itself", explains the director of Cybersecurity of the Institutional Security Office of the Presidency of the Republic (GSI), Luiz Fernando Moraes.

DEPUTIES PRESENT PROPOSAL FOR LEGAL FRAMEWORK ON CYBERSECURITY IN PARAGUAY

La Nacion - Legislators from different parties in the Chamber of Deputies presented a bill seeking to establish the first comprehensive cybersecurity regulatory framework in Paraguay, responding to the growing digital threats the country faces in a context of increased digitalization. The initiative, called the "Cybersecurity Law of the Republic of Paraguay," aims to protect critical infrastructure, information, and digital systems, as well as guarantee people's rights against cyber threats and crimes.

BORDERS, AIRPORTS, AND CYBERSECURITY: US AND GUATEMALA SIGN NEW SECURITY PROGRAM

LaHora - During her official visit to Guatemala, U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security Kristi Noem, along with Interior Minister Francisco Jiménez, signed a Memorandum of Understanding to establish the Joint Security Program between the two nations. Before the signing, Noem held a meeting with President Bernardo Arévalo and other Guatemalan officials, where they discussed topics related to inter-institutional cooperation, border security, and the fight against organized crime.

57% OF SMES IN LATIN AMERICA REPORT AN INCREASE IN CYBERATTACKS: HOW CAN YOU PREPARE FOR THEM?

Yahoo - Over the past year, more than half of small and medium-sized businesses (SMEs) in Latin America have reported an increase in cyberattacks against this sector. Furthermore, 20% of these companies admit they are not adequately protected against cyberthreats or only have basic protection against challenges such as phishing, malware, BEC attacks, and ransomware.

US GOVERNMENT WARNS OF NEW IRAN-LINKED CYBER THREATS ON CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Cybersecurity Dive - U.S. government officials said critical infrastructure operators should be on alert for Iranian cyberattacks. In a threat advisory published Monday, multiple agencies said Iran might target U.S. firms “for near-term cyber operations” due to “the current geopolitical environment” — a reference to the Trump administration joining Israel’s aerial campaign against Iran’s nuclear program and related assets. Defense contractors, especially firms that have relationships with Israeli companies, are likely at heightened risk of targeting, according to the advisory.

CYBERCRIME GROUP IS TARGETING AIRLINES, FBI SAYS: HOW ARE PASSENGERS BEING AFFECTED?

The Hill - A cybercrime organization known as “Scattered Spider” has been targeting airlines based in North America in recent weeks, attempting to gain access to sensitive data for purposes of extortion, the FBI confirmed in an alert issued Friday. “They target large corporations and their third-party IT providers, which means anyone in the airline ecosystem, including trusted vendors and contractors, could be at risk,” the alert reads, in part.

SOUTH AMERICA ADOPTS ZERO-TRUST PRINCIPLES

Afcea - While the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) works to meet its 2027 zero trust cybersecurity framework deadline, South American nations are adopting the concept across their own infrastructures. Zero trust, a term coined by Forrester Research analyst John Kindervag, refers to the principle of continuous verification for information access. In general, it promotes high-level data security to mitigate risks of adversarial breaches. The DOD, having released its first zero-trust strategy in 2022, is on track to meet its goal by September 2027, according to the office of the DOD Chief Information Officer.
