CONGRESS CALLS FOR A FORMAL SESSION AND SETS AN AGENDA FOR LAWS ON CYBERCRIME AND MONEY LAUNDERING - GUATEMALA

Prensa Libre – Luis Alberto Contreras Colíndres, president of Congress, has called a solemn session of deputies for Tuesday, June 2, at noon to commemorate Constitution Day, according to circular 22-2026 from the Legislative Area. Congress has scheduled an extraordinary session for 2:00 p.m. to discuss initiatives related to strengthening the budget of the Supreme Electoral Tribunal, the National Cybersecurity System Law, and reforms against money laundering.

THE GUATEMALAN GOVERNMENT AND THE EUROPEAN UNION STRENGTHEN COOPERATION ON TRADE AND SECURITY

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC LEADS DIGITAL ADVANCEMENT IN CENTRAL AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN

Economía – The Dominican Republic is positioning itself as one of the fastest-evolving countries in Central America and the Caribbean in terms of digital transformation, with a growing awareness of the need to strengthen digitization processes, especially in the financial and government sectors. This was stated by Wilson Calderón, technical manager for Latin America at ManageEngine, a company specializing in IT management and cybersecurity with a presence in 190 countries and more than 280,000 organizations using its solutions.

PANAMA STRENGTHENS ITS CYBERSECURITY STRATEGY IN RESPONSE TO INCREASED CYBER RISK

Ciber Latam - The National Authority for Government Innovation (AIG) has defined its proactive cybersecurity stance in response to the increased cyber risk, at a time when Panama is moving towards digitalization in public services, critical operations, and government platforms. Adolfo Fábrega, AIG's general administrator, recently explained that the increased cyber risk is a consequence of an increasingly sophisticated global threat environment.

PANAMA AND SINGAPORE PROMOTE STRATEGIC ALLIANCE IN TRADE AND TECHNOLOGY

Forbes - The governments of Panama and Singapore expressed their intention to strengthen bilateral ties, focusing on trade and innovation, during a visit to the Central American country by Singaporean Foreign Minister Vivian Balakrishnan. The Foreign Minister of the Asian nation arrived in Panama yesterday and was received this Monday by Panamanian President José Raúl Mulino, as well as Foreign Minister Javier Martínez-Acha and Minister of Commerce and Industry Julio Moltó, according to official statements.

BRAZILIAN COMPANIES SUFFERED 4,118 HACKER ATTACKS PER WEEK. GENERATIVE AI EXPOSES SENSITIVE DATA FROM 90% OF ORGANIZATIONS

Convergencia Digital - Brazilian companies suffered an average of 4,118 attacks per week, registering a 46% jump compared to the same period in 2025, easily surpassing the global average of 2,201 weekly attacks per organization, reveals the Global Threat Intelligence Report for April 2026, conducted by researchers at Check Point Research (CPR), the threat intelligence division of Check Point Software.

ANATEL SAYS IT IS READY TO TAKE OVER CYBERSECURITY IN BRAZIL

Teletime - The national entity that will be responsible for coordinating and overseeing digital security actions in Brazil remains one of the main points of debate in the Cybersecurity Legal Framework, foreseen in Bill (PL) 4.752/2025. The subject was discussed at the ABR Security Summit Panel, which took place at the Telebrasil Summit 2026 Panel this Wednesday, the 20th.

gov.br - The Brazilian Government published, in the Official Gazette of the Union this Thursday (21), two decrees signed by President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva that update the regulation of the Civil Framework for the Internet and establish new guidelines for the protection of women in the digital environment. The measures detail duties applicable to internet application providers, reinforce mechanisms for preventing and mitigating the massive circulation of criminal content and expand the protection of users, especially women victims of online violence.

LULA DECREES NEW RULES FOR BIG TECH COMPANIES TO OPERATE IN BRAZIL; UNDERSTAND THE RULES

CNN - President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva (PT) signed two decrees this Wednesday (20) that create new rules for the operation of digital platforms, the so-called big techs, in Brazil. The measures should be published in the DOU (Official Gazette of the Union) on Thursday (21). The signing took place during a ceremony alluding to the 100 days of the National Pact Brazil Against Femicide, held at the Planalto Palace.

Mercosur - The defense ministries, information technology secretariats, and directors of the strategic intelligence agencies of the Mercosur nations have finalized the institutional design of the Mercosur Unified Cyber Incident Response Center, a highly complex technological supranational body intended to coordinate digital defense, standardize state data protection protocols, and repel coordinated transnational cyberattacks aimed at sabotaging the critical infrastructure of the Southern Cone.
