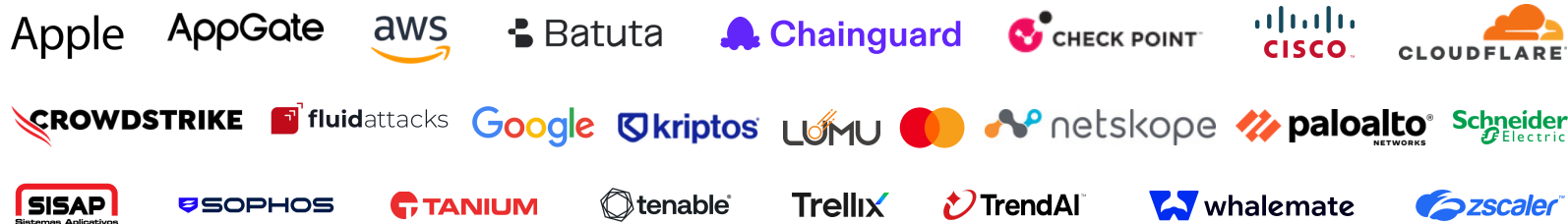

VICE PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL CONGRESS PROMOTES LAW AGAINST HARASSMENT AND DISCRIMINATION ON SOCIAL MEDIA - HONDURAS

Hondudiario – Vice President of the National Congress Johana Bermúdez presented a Cybersecurity Protection Bill to the full legislature on Monday, aimed at preventing and combating harassment, discrimination, and other attacks perpetrated through social media. Bermúdez, a National Party representative for Francisco Morazán, focuses particularly on women who participate in public and political spheres, who, she argued, are frequent victims of offensive messages, threats, and discriminatory campaigns on digital platforms.

AIG ACTIVATES CYBERSECURITY OPERATIONS CENTER TO MONITOR ATTACKS AGAINST PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS - PANAMA

TVN Panama – The Government Innovation Authority (AIG) announced this Wednesday on Noticias AM the launch of the Cybersecurity Operations Center (SOC), a unit that will allow for the continuous monitoring of public institutions' networks and the detection of potential threats before they escalate into major incidents. AIG Administrator Adolfo Fábrega explained that one of the main objectives is to shift from a strategy focused primarily on reacting to attacks to a model of surveillance and prevention.

BRAZILIAN ARMY ORGANIZES NATIONAL CYBERSECURITY TRAINING - BRAZIL

Hora do Povo – The Brazilian Army will hold the eighth edition of the Cyber Guardian Exercise (EGC 8.0) in September, recognized as the largest cyber defense training exercise in the Southern Hemisphere. The Armed Forces, federal government, regulatory agencies, academia, and companies are some of the institutions that will participate in the event. The five-day exercise is divided into: training to combat cyberattacks; systems monitoring; attack simulation; deterrence of aggression; and discussion of the conclusions.

GUATEMALA'S NATIONAL CIVIL POLICE WARN OF AN INCREASE IN DIGITAL SCAMS

Infobae – Guatemala's National Civil Police warned of an increase in digital scams and urged the public to take extra precautions against deceptions carried out via WhatsApp, fraudulent links, and identity theft. According to data from the Public Prosecutor's Office, cybercrimes rose from 1,292 cases in 2019 to 14,871 in 2025, and 7,925 complaints of online fraud were registered in the first half of 2026.

GUATEMALA COURT INFORMATION IS SAFE AFTER CYBERATTACK

Prensa Latina – The president of Guatemala's Constitutional Court (CC), Anabella Morfin, confirmed today that the documents and information are safe, following a cyberattack on the institution's system yesterday. "Undoubtedly, the aim is always to gain something," the magistrate stated this morning on the program "A Primera Hora" on Emisoras Unidas. "The intention is to encrypt the information to obtain some financial benefit," she emphasized, while clarifying that fortunately they have a backup of all the documents.

EL SALVADOR SEEKS TO STRENGTHEN TECHNOLOGICAL ALLIANCE WITH SOUTH KOREA, SAYS AMBASSADOR IN SEOUL

Diario El Mundo – The new Salvadoran ambassador to South Korea, Federico Miguel Guerrero Avendaño, outlined an agenda to strengthen bilateral cooperation through projects related to artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, digital identity, and technological innovation, with the goal of attracting new investments and expanding exchanges between the two countries. In an interview with The Korea Herald, the diplomat emphasized that South Korean President Lee Jae Myung's vision of an AI-driven economy presents an opportunity to deepen the relationship between the two nations.

EL SALVADOR IS THE FIFTH LATIN AMERICAN COUNTRY WITH THE GREATEST CYBER RESILIENCE

Diario El Mundo – El Salvador is the fifth Latin American country best prepared to face cyberattacks, reflecting progress in strengthening its capabilities to prevent, respond to, and recover from such incidents, according to the Regional Cyber Resilience Ranking by Sistemas Aplicativos S.A. (SISAP). According to the index, El Salvador obtained a cyber resilience score of 41%. The country is surpassed by the Dominican Republic, which leads the regional ranking with 54%, followed by Costa Rica (53%), Panama (49%), and Colombia (48%).

MEXICO USES AI TO TRACK FRAUD AND FREEZES \$2 MILLION BEING SENT TO OTHER COUNTRIES

Infobae – The Secretariat of Security and Citizen Protection (SSPC) reported that the use of artificial intelligence tools supported an investigation into a network that used manipulated images and videos of public officials to promote fraudulent investments. The tracking of funds sent to various countries led to the freezing of more than \$2 million. The investigation involved the country's 54 Cyber Police Units and was conducted in coordination with the Financial Intelligence Unit (UIF), which traced the destination of the funds transferred abroad.

US SAYS IT WILL RESPECT PARAGUAY'S NUCLEAR ENERGY DECISION AND HIGHLIGHTS ACTIONS UNDER THE SOFA AGREEMENT

Última Hora – Speaking with Radio Monumental 1080 AM, the Chargé d'Affaires of the U.S. Embassy in Paraguay discussed the agreements reached with the Paraguayan government, which he explained strengthen areas such as security, cybersecurity, critical minerals, technology, and artificial intelligence, in line with the foreign policy promoted by U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio. "Rubio was clear about our foreign policy vision: we seek a safer, stronger, and more prosperous United States and its allies," he stated.

CHILEAN JUSTICE SYSTEM INVESTIGATES ALLEGED CYBERATTACKS BY CHINESE HACKERS AGAINST TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMPANIES

Infobae – The Chilean Public Prosecutor's Office opened a confidential investigation in February of this year into the alleged crime of computer sabotage, following a report from the United States that warned of suspected cyberattacks by hackers associated with the Chinese government. These attacks reportedly affected at least three telecommunications companies and a construction firm operating in Chile. The report, which was obtained by the newspaper El Mercurio, was delivered by Ambassador Brandon Judd to the then Minister of Public Security, Luis Cordero, amidst bilateral tensions over the so-called "Chinese cable" that would connect Valparaíso and Hong Kong.

ICT MINISTRY ISSUES CYBERSECURITY ALERT AMID ABELARDO DE LA ESPRIELLA'S POSSESSION: WARNED – COLOMBIA

Semana – Colombia is preparing for one of the most anticipated moments of August 7th: the official ceremony in which Abelardo De La Espriella will assume the presidency, accompanied by an 18-ministerial cabinet known as "Patria Milagro" (Miracle Homeland). The event will take place in Cali and will be broadcast across various digital platforms. However, due to the high visibility the event will receive, experts and security agencies have drawn attention to the potential risks in the digital environment during such a significant occasion.
